Hard Work - Done Well - Feels Good

I am a firm believer in putting a positive, brave foot forward, doing one's best, and adapting along the way to ensure success. In fact, all students at LOA will hear a repeated message from me all year: I gleaned it from a principal I knew many years ago and have shared it in both schools I led in the past: Hard Work - Done Well - Feels Good. There's a lot to that statement. It honors industriousness, a commitment to working through struggle to create something good, and it also speaks to feelings. Feelings can sneak up on all of us...especially when we are trying new or difficult things. I believe we owe it to our students to allow them their feelings: to help them recognize them, understand them, express them, problem solve with them, and learn how to grow with them. Your child's social emotional development is equally important to their academic growth. We will support them in both!
