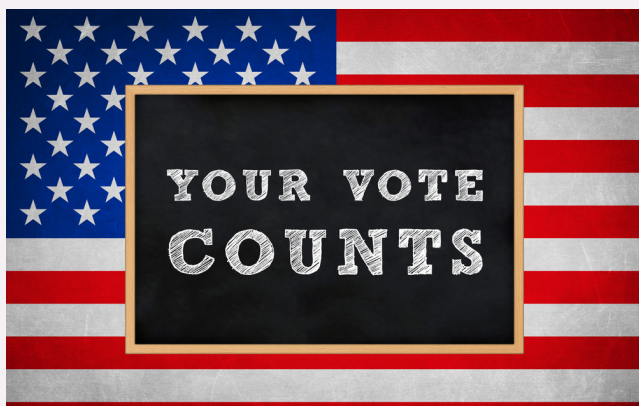

FAQ

(Q) What Does the Supplemental Levy fund?

(A) In our district, the supplemental levy funds:

- The gap between what we receive from the state for staff compensation and what it actually costs.
- The gap between what we receive from the state for our transportation program and what it costs to run our buses every day.
- Fully funds all extracurricular activities.
- Funds our safety program; and fully funds the purchase of curriculum.

(Q) Why is the levy election every two years?

(A) According to Idaho Statute a supplemental levy can only be run for two years at a time. We currently run a supplemental levy every two years because the state only funds about 75% of what it takes to run the School District.

(Q) What Does the Plant Facility Levy fund?

(A) In our district, the plant facilities levy provides the funds to maintain our buildings, purchase buses/vehicles, and purchase equipment.

(Q) Can we collect impact fees?

(A) No. At this time, it is not legal for school districts in the state of Idaho to collect impact fees. We may see some movement on this topic in this year's legislative session.
